

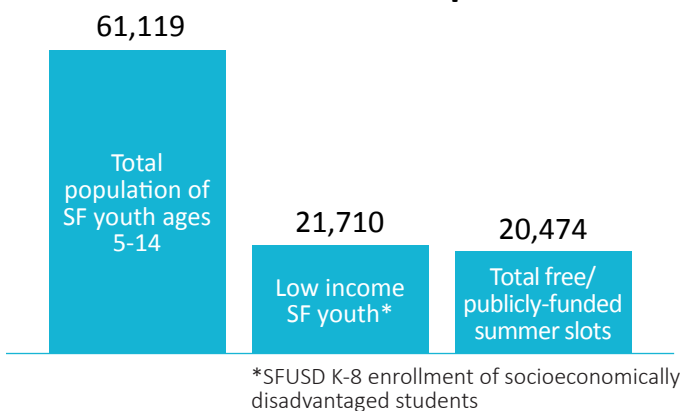


Summer in the City

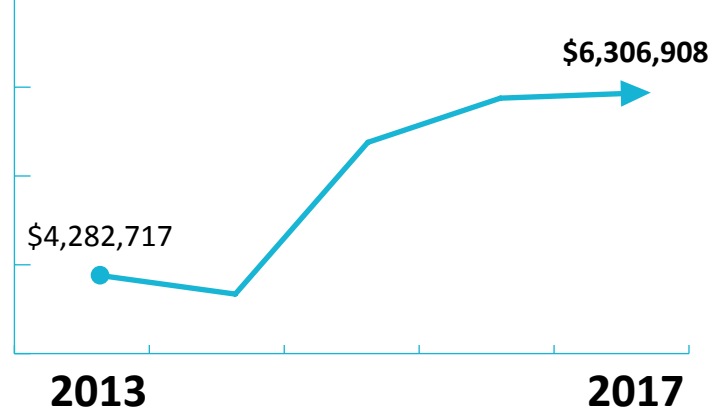
Free and SF-funded programs

Free and publically funded summer programs across San Francisco provide safe spaces for youth to play, learn, and grow. These programs keep kids active and allow youth to explore new interests. Many programs also work to reduce summer learning loss by providing youth with opportunities to practice academic skills learned during the school year. Between 2013 and 2017, DCYF invested \$27.3 million in summer programming through our K-8 community and school-based summer programs in our Out of School Time service area supporting 106 programs through 47 agencies. DCYF and our partners from city government agencies, the school district and community-based organizations are committed to making San Francisco a great place to grow up.

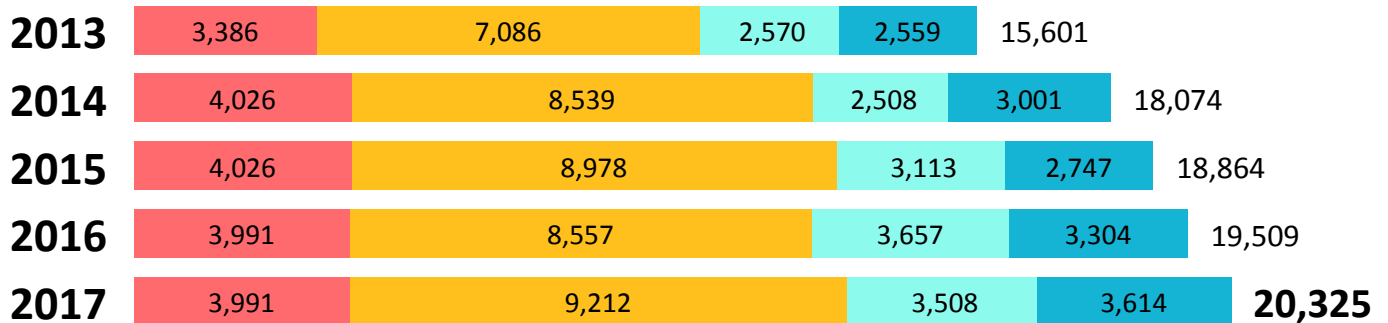
Summer 2017 Snapshot

Licensed Child Care Centers & Family Child Care Homes serving youth ages 6-13

Licensed Child Care Centers and Family Child Care Homes are licensed by the State of California to provide childcare year round, including in the summer, in a commercial or residential group setting, respectively. In summer, many of these programs provide youth with additional opportunities for enrichment such as outdoor activities and field trips.

School-based summer programs

SFUSD Early Education Department school-age programs, ExCEL programs, and SF Beacons programs operate continuously for at least five weeks of summer at over 60 SFUSD school sites. In these programs, youth have opportunities to participate in a wide variety of enrichment and recreation activities in addition to receiving continued academic support.

Community-based summer programs

DCYF annually funds 45-50 comprehensive K-8 summer learning programs operated by local community based organizations. These programs offer opportunities for recreation and enrichment. Youth in DCYF-funded programs also receive literacy and math support.

Recreation & Parks Summer Programs

Each year, the San Francisco Recreation and Parks Department funds over 75 summer camp programs at Recreation and Parks sites in San Francisco. These programs operate for at least 3 hours per day, 5 days per week throughout the summer. Many of them have a specific focus on sports, art, or outdoor activities.
